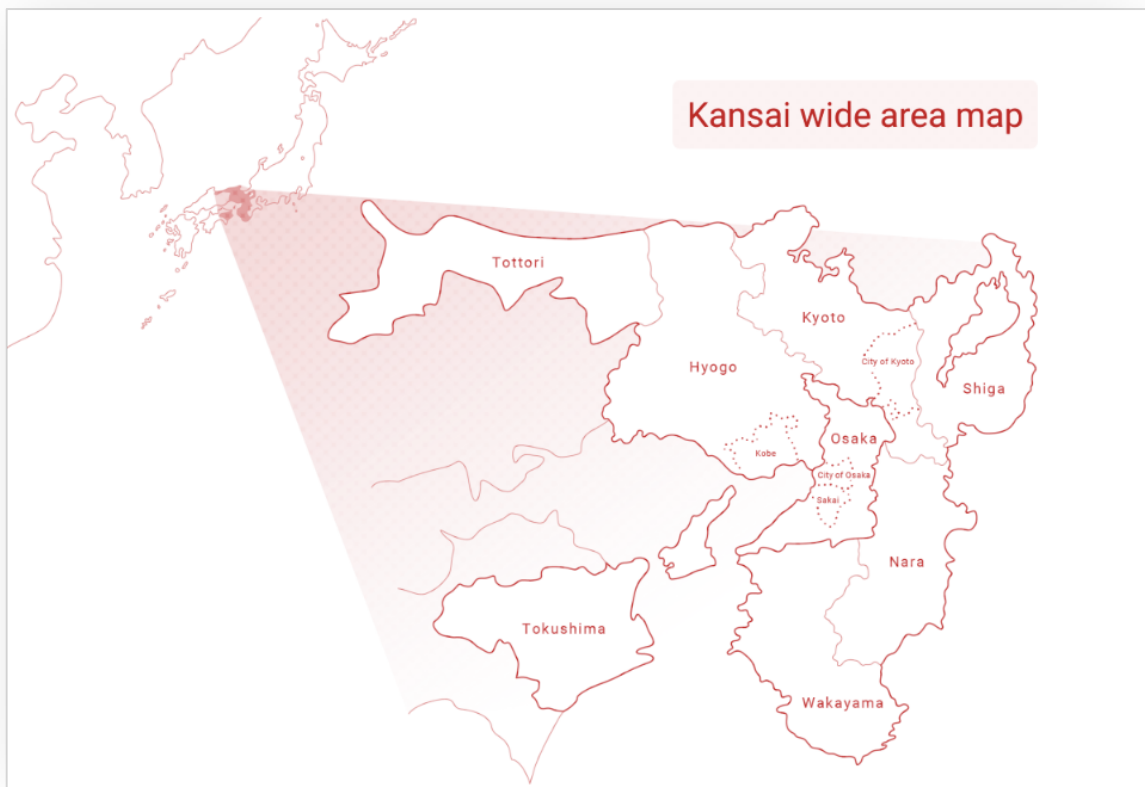


Kansai Region in Japan Launched Informational Site of Potential Business Partners for Overseas Companies

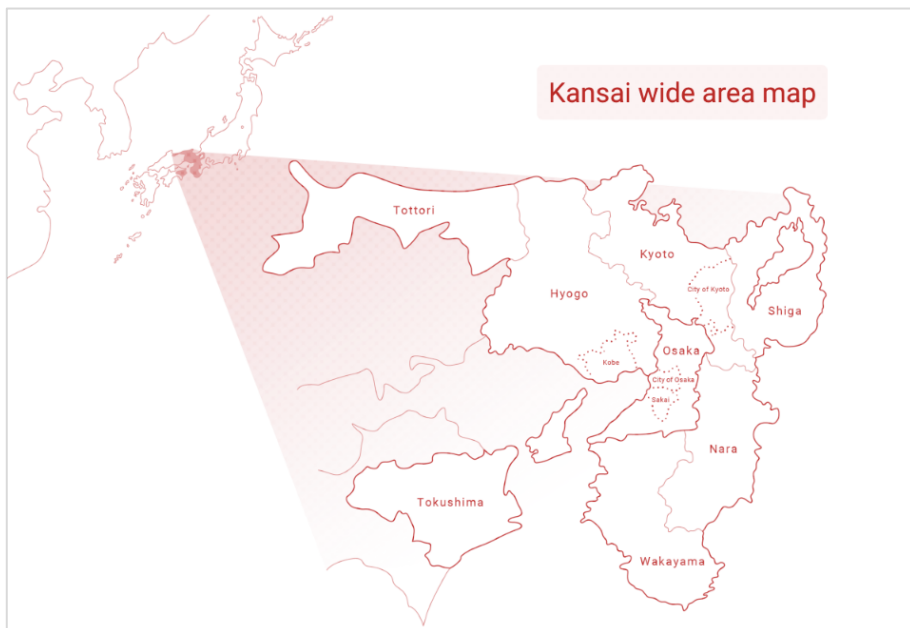

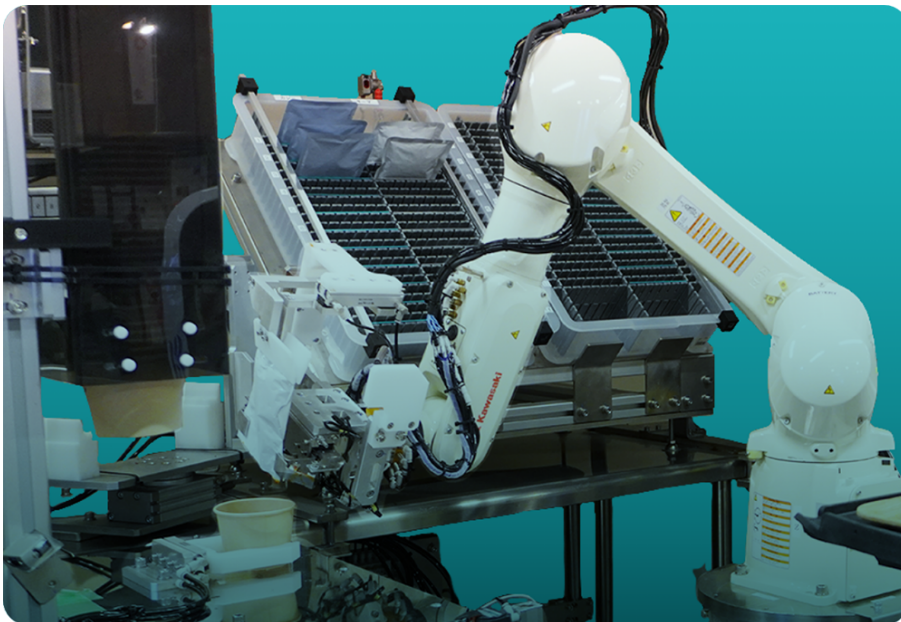
